Know all men by these presents that we
Frederick Burtz & James H. Chamberlain
are held and firmly bound unto the honorable
able the Justices of the Superior Court of
said County, setting for ordinary purposes, and their
successors in office, in the just and full sum of five
hundred dollars, for the payment of which sum, to the
said Justices, & their successors, we bind ourselves, our
heirs, executors and administrators, in the whole and
for the whole sum, jointly, severally; & firmly by these
presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this
tenth day of January Eighteen hundred forty eight

The Condition of the above obligation
is such, that if the above bound Frederick Burtz
administrator of the Estate, real and personal, of William
G Ballation late of this County, deceased, do make
a true and perfect inventory, of the Estate, both real
and personal of said deceased, which have or shall
come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said
Frederick Cherokee County Wills 1848-1854 possession of any
person or persons, the same so made, at
Exhibit into the said Court of ordinary, when he shall be
thereunto required, and such Estates do well and truly
administer according to law, and do make a just and
true account of his actions and doings therein, where
the said Frederick Burtz shall be thereunto required
by the Court of ordinary for said County, and all the rest of the said
Estate, which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said
administrator, the same being first allowed by the Court, shall
deliver and pay to such person or persons, respectively, as are
entitled to the same by law, and if it shall hereafter appear, that
any balance still remains due and owing by the deceased, and
that the same cannot be paid by the said Frederick Burtz, and
such balance of the same shall be paid by the said
Frederick Burtz and James H. Chamberlain, and such
balance left the said Frederick Burtz and James H. Chamberlain
obligation to be paid, till the same can be paid.
