Brooke late of this County deceased do make a true and perfect inventory of all the Estate both real and personal of the said deceased, which have or shall come to the hands possession or knowledge of the said Elizabeth Brooke or unto the hands or possession of any other person or persons for him; and the same so made do exhibit to the said Court of Ordinary when she shall be thereto required, & such Estate do well & truly administer according to law and do make a just and true account of her actings and doings therein when she shall be thereto required, by the Court of Ordinary for said County and all the rest of the said Estate which shall be found remaining upon the account of the said administration the same being first allowed by the Court, then to pay to such person or persons respectively, as may be entitled to the same by law, and if it shall be the order of the Court that any debt or claim be paid by the said deceased and the same be proven before the Court & the Court shall give a certificate of probate thereof & the said Elizabeth Brooke do in such case if required render and deliver up the said letters of administration when this obligation to be void else remain in full force
