I will and bequeath to my dearly beloved Brother Albert Newton Macey all my property, and of kinds whatsoever, whether real or personal, of which I may be possessed at the time of my death. It being my desire that he shall

Make it in fee simple, to dispose of in such manner as he may wish, to the exclusion of all other Brothers.
