(Clarke County)

I Alexander Woodson of the County of Newton and State of Georgia, (which is my residence being only temporarily domiciled in the County of Clarke aforesaid, by reason of feeble health) being of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, Ordain, publish, and declare this to be my last Will and Testament, hereby Revoking all Wills by me heretofore made;

Item 1st = I Commend my Soul to God; through the merits of the Lord Jesus Christ, and my body to my family; and friends to be buried in a plain decent manner;

Item 2^d = I wish my just debts paid.

Item 3rd = It is my Will and desire that my three Children John, W. Woodson, Cornelia, M. Durham, and Mary, Elized, Woodson, at my death, should share my Estate equally; with the following exceptions, viz., My Son in law Willard, L. Durham, must account to my Estate for six hundred dollars (\$600⁰⁰) it being in consideration of Negro Woman Esther given ^{him} several years ago, before he comes in for his equal share in right of his wife Cornelia M. and in view of the fact of his express kind intention not to charge for attention to and board of myself and my deceased wife he is to receive for his wife my Foster Pinnna, and not to be charged for it. The wishes of my wife, in regard to specified articles of furniture to be divided, among the Children, and by them understood, to be regarded, and scrupulously carried out in accordance with her direction. This division of my Estate to be made by public sale or otherwise.

Item 4th = My gold headed cane is not to be considered as part of my Estate but I give it to my Son beloved Son John V. exhorting him when he rec'd it with this, his father's gift, to walk in wisdom's ways that remuneration of his journey may be that he not made with hands eternal in the heavens.

Item 5th = I hereby Nominate, Constitute, and appoint, My Friend and Brother in law John Harrell of the County of Clarke and State of Georgia, Executor of and to this my last Will and Testament, Vesting him with plenary powers to postpone, or delay the Sale of any of the property of my Estate, when in his judgment a sale of the same would result in a sacrifice thereof; it being my intention, to confer upon him as large discretion, as may be possible in order that the property sold may bring its full value, and to guard against any sudden depression; and enable him to avail himself of auspicious fluctuations in trade and prices.

Item 6th - In Case my Executor herein appointed, Cannot Possibly qualify and act - (The Administrator that shall be appointed by the Court, May and should exercise a sound discretion as to the time of Sale of Property for the reasons given above in Vesting my Executor with plenary power.

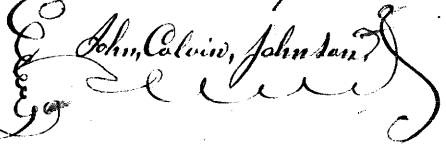

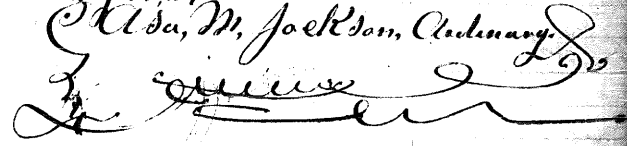
