I Anselm L. Harper Senior of the County and State aforesaid, being of sound mind and disposing memory do make Ordain: publish and declare, this to be my last will and Testament hereby revoking all Wills by me theretofore made.

Item 1st.

I wish my just debts paid.

Item 2nd.

I gave Martha Parker several years ago a negro girl which is in full her legacy.

Item 3rd.

I gave Sarah Bridgeway, another daughter, two hundred dollars which is in full her legacy.

Item 4th.

I give and bequeath unto my son Johnathan Harper Fifty Acres of land in said County, joining Mrs. Vincent, embracing the house where he now lives and including the ground which he now cultivates.

Item 5th.

I give and bequeath unto my son Anselm L. Harper Jr. Fifty Acres of land in said County, joining Thornton, including his dwelling, house, half in Old Field, the other half woodland or forest cleared.

Item 6th.

I give and bequeath unto my son George Harper as Trustee for my daughter Mary Crapo and her children, Fifty Acres of land in said County, including the house where she now lives and twenty five Acres around said house, the other twenty five acres of the land now cleared and under fence.

Item 7th.

I give and bequeath unto my son in law David H. Malcolm, Fifty acres of land in said County commencing at our Hickory corner, half to be woodland, the other half cleared and inclosed, being a South West corner from said Hickory on line between said Malcolm, myself I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Lucinda Harper and my son George Harper jointly, and for their joint use & support all the balance of my land in said County including all the appurtenances, Stock of every kind, stills indeed every thing else I now own. And if my Son George Harper survives his mother, then the same to be this Absolutely, but if my beloved wife survives said son George, and he leaves no children, then the same shall be equally divided between my children and the grand children of any of my children, who may be dead, the portion of Mary Crapo, children to be in trust as aforesaid, a Trustee to be appointed by the proper Authority.

Item 8th.

I hereby nominate, constitute, appoint my son George Harper Executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby exempting him from making, returns or Inventory & Appraisement or incurring any expense for Office fees further than paying this Will before the proper Court.

Item 9th.

On Testimony Whereof the said Anselm L. Harper Senior have hereunto set my hand & seal this 20th day of November 1861.
