publish and declare this to be my last
Will & Testament, hereby directing all
affairs

1st I have given to my son, Benjamin
a tract of land in Agiotonpe County of
which he is now in possession, known as
the "Young British" farm, containing
between nine hundred and ten thousand
acres, and it is my will that in the dis-
tribution of my estate, he shall account
for the same as an advancement
of three thousand dollars. I have
also advanced him in Cash and other
property, consisting of a horse, a pair
of mules, a wagon and a pair of oxen, to
be included in the said advancement, amount-
ing to, I judge, five hundred dollars, for
which he is also to account in the said
distribution of my estate.

2nd I have advanced to my daughter, a sum
purchased in the State of California, for which she is to account in the
said distribution of my estate at five
hundred & twenty-five dollars.

3rd After accounting for these advancements,
it is my will that the balance of my estate
be equally divided between my two children,
Sudiput & Urahella.

4th I hereby appoint my son, Benjamin, to
be the executor of this my
last Will & Testament.

My executor, need make no inventory &
appraisal of my estate, nor any
return to the Court, & he is authorized
to sell my goods, real & personal, without
the privilege of selling or disposing of property, either
at public or private sale, without an
order of Court, or without advertising,
provided he obtains the written consent
of his sister, Urahella.
