Clarke County, <sup>do</sup> declare & publish the following as my last Will & Testament

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I give to my son W.C. Mc. Ross as Trustee for his sister Lucy James Ross  
for her sole <sup>&</sup> separation with honor of dispositions by Will, and his  
single & married, the following property viz 50 Shares of the stock of the Ga. R.  
R. & N.Y. R.R. Company standing in my name, One Bond on the South Western  
Rail. Road, for One Thousand dollars now in my possession, all of my  
shares in the Athens Bank, just as they are with me right to call upon my  
Estate to pay any apportionment on this sum; the following Negro & their increase  
present or future Mary, Emily, Peggy & Edmund & his children, so I further, also  
my slave house & lot in Graduate Street in the town of Athens with the right to  
the dividends existing on said bonds & Rail-Road Stock & Bank Stock, &c.  
rent of the said house from my death & also one half of all my furniture house  
hold & Kitchen.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my son W.C. Mc. Ross the following property all my shares in the  
Paper Mill Company in Clarke County now owned by state like at March  
1<sup>st</sup> his wife & Andrew's second Son of Luke & to Mittie P. Ross my  
Grandson as man by name Louis 3<sup>rd</sup> Son of Luke

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my Son S.C. Ross the following property all that tract of land  
containing about 60 Acres adjoining Colham known as my farm except a  
portion to be cut off from the side next to Mrs. Phoebe Hunting in that  
said or street our acre in front & I do conclude which I wish my Executed  
to sell either publicly or privately & to appropriate the proceeds before any &  
my other property to the payment of my debts. I give my said Son Sidney  
also my Neg. Man Edmund.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my Son Andrew T.S. Ross the House & Lot in which I now reside  
one half of the Household Kitchen furniture & the following negroes Henry &  
(Robert the oldest Son of Luke).

Item 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my Grandson Charles L. Son of S.C. Ross, a negro boy named Charley  
youngest son of Luke & after his father's death to whom I give a life estate in  
Gold Watch.

Item 6<sup>th</sup> I give to my three sons equally my lot or tract of Land in Minnesota.  
The residue of my property if any left after paying my debts I give to my Sons  
& their Sister Jane to be equally divided between them & I will that this negro boy  
for this year if I should die this year form a part of their residue  
I nominate & appoint my sons W.C. Mc. & S.C. Ross my Executed to carry out  
this Will, publishing all Wills heretofore made by me

Item 1<sup>st</sup>

I Charles M. Russ do declare the following to be a Codicil to my last Will & Testament.

The House & Lot given to my son W. W. Russ with the furniture of the same, household & Kitchen & my buggy horse & carriage I will to my daughter Lucy A. Russ for her sole & separate use, & the store house & yard hereunto given to her I do Will to my son W. W. Russ in the same manner as the house above mentioned

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I will to my Son S. O. Russ after cutting off two lots to his described directly my small farm heretofore given to him with all the crop growing & gathered & all the Stock & thence of every sort & all the tools of every kind want with the farm & if I die before the crop is made, then for that year of the negroes working on the other farms to gather & make the crop if he desires them. The lots excepted from said farm & just referred to another following, one running North from Mrs. Phenial corner out this road to a stone & part to our said farm, devolving, and by reason thereof I design for sale & then back over a half acres each, which lots to be laid out & joining Mrs. Phenial & the lot I design for sale, & I Will to my son W. M. Russ the other lot excepted as above to begin at said post or rock corner & running north in the public roads to another post or rock corner & then back to certain in all a long & wide to embrace all the buildings I have put up & am now putting up, I wish to be sold for the purpose of paying my debts particularly & exclusively said lot, to be about three acres back the lot herein given to W. M. Russ I wish to contain three acres.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

I wish my servant Sukie to remain in Athens & where ever it may reside so long as agreeable to my Son Sidney O. Russ & that his son given to my grandchild O. M. P. Russ shall remain with him to learn the trade of a Carpenter. Signed, Sealed & Published, as a Codicil to my Will by Charles M. Russ this 11<sup>th</sup> day of April, 1862, in presence of
