I M C Greer 1796 of the County
 And State aforesaid being of sound Mind and
 disposing Memory, but knowing that all must die, do
 hereby make this as my last Will and Testament;
 Item 1st I Will that all my Just debts be paid, leaving at
 with my wife, Francisca Elizabeth Greer to see any
 portion of my Real or personal property she may find
 most convenient to settle said debts
 Item 2nd I Will and bequeath to my wife Francisca Elizabeth
 Greer the whole of my Estate both Real and personal,
 household and kitchen furniture plantation tools &c &c, to
 her forever to have and to use as she may deem necessary
 for her own use and benefit. And when my son John
 Thomas Greer becomes of age, I will and desire that she
 (my wife) Francisca Elizabeth Greer do give him
 the sum of Three Thousand Five hundred dollars in Money
 or property as may suit her convenience best, being the
 amount I gave my other children.

Item 3 I Will and desire that my son John Thomas
 Greer have my Gold Watch and Chain.

 as if for his last Will & Testament, and that he declared & acknowledged
 the same to be his last Will and Testament; that at the time of his
 making said acknowledgment he was of sound and disposing Mind and
 Memory, that they signed the same as witnesses in the presence of the testator
 and of each other and at his request, and also saw Allen P. Deering
 sign the same as a witness in the presence of the testator and at
 his request, and that said Deering was present with them, and said
 Deering when said testator made said acknowledgements of his
 said signature & of said instrument being his last Will & Testament
 I was requested by said testator to take notice of his said acknowledgements
 & that said Deering then signed the same as a witness as aforesaid
