Item first =

I give and devise to my only daughter Anne Rebecca Herring widow formerly Anne Rebecca Moore one hundred acres of the tract of land where I reside lying on the right side of the public road leading from Athens to Lexington Atlanta lying and being in said county, and including the dwelling ~~and~~ other houses thereto attached to have and to hold the same to her and her heirs forever in fee simple.

Item second =

I give and devise the rest and remainder of said tract of land to my sons William Craig Moore and John Craig Moore and the son and daughter of my deceased son Robert to wit: John and Elizabeth, and to their heirs, William Craig Moore taking a third in value of said balance of the land, John Craig Moore a third and the grand children John and Elizabeth Moore the remaining third in value.

Item third

I give and bequeath to my son William Craig Moore my book case and books the same being originally the property of his grand father William Craig who always spoken of as for said William Craig Moore devised by him.

Item fourth

I give bequeath and devise to my daughter Anne Rebecca Herring all the rest and residue of my estate of every kind and make her my executor legatee.

Item fifth

I appoint and appoint my son William Craig Moore executor of this my last will and testament and request him to accept the office and qualify.
