proper to make a disposition of what
real property I may possess do make
ordain and publish this as my last
Will and testament, writing out all
other matters, made by me

Item 1st I desire all my just debts first
paid out of my Estate

Item 2nd I have this day left in Trust by Deed
to my Daughter Francis C. Williamson,
wife of James Williamson a tract on
Parcel of land in Jackson County, Con-
taining two hundred eighty acres, the
same being the place purchased of
William A. Thurman - Seventh Novem-
ber 1845

Item 3rd

I give bequeath and devise to my be-
loved wife Mary A. Fellows all my
property real and personal, and of all
kinds and description, whosoever that I
may be possessed of with full pow-
er to dispose of or do as she shall prop-
er with the same

Item 4th

I hereby constitute and appoint my
beloved wife Mary A. Fellows, Executrix
of this my last Will & Testament, this
December 11th 1867

and Testament in the presence of us, the
undersigned, who subscribed our names
here to the presence of said Testator, at
his special request and request and
in the presence of each other this Dec.
11th 1867

publish my last Will and Testament, in

for mark and publish this codicil to said
Will & Testament.

Here 1st

I hereby authorize my Executors Mary
Adams to dispose with the necessity of
making an inventory or returns upon my
estate, as required by the Statute, only so
far as she may think proper to do,
this December 11th 1847

and published by Geo. P. Fellows as a codicil
to his Will and Testament, of this date, in the
presence of the undersigned, who subscribed
our names here to in the presence of said
Testator & at his instance & request, and
in the presence of each other, this Dec-
ember 11th 1847

quest.
