I Peter Jennings of said County do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament Truly trusting all others by me hereafter at any time made

- 1 I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Jennings with whom I now live One Thousand Dollars to be held and enjoyed by her during her life and to be disposed of according to her Will after her death
- 2 I give and bequeath unto my said Wife the residue of all my Estate during her natural life or widowhood. She again may after my death she may hold certain land being One third part of my said Estate and only one third during her natural life provided her future husband shall enter into bond with approved security in said County for the return and delivery of said parcel to my Executors hereafter named or to the proper and legal representatives of my said Estate, except the One Thousand Dollars given in the first of this my last Will and Testament which one Thousand shall constitute a part of the one third of my Estate above named. Provided further that in no event shall any portion of my said Estate to remain from said County of Clarke before the death of my said Wife or of in case of her marriage, or until she may at any time of her own free will and should release any portion of said Estate for division among the Legates in Consideration hereinafter named, and then only such portions of said Estate may be removed from the County as may have been divided among said Legates in Consideration or have been legally sold for that purpose.
- 3 I do and bequeath the Remainder of all my said Estate both real and personal to the Children of my Brothers and Sisters of the whole blood. To wit the Children of Henry Jennings Deceased one share, to the Children of Robert Jennings one share, to the Children of Citty Edson Wife of Lewis Edson one share, to the Children of Pamela Edson widow one share, and to the Children of Mary Jennings Deceased Wife of Caleb Jennings one share.
