Item 2nd In Consideration of the love affection and concern
Kinship manifested towards me by my beloved wife
(a painted off) Ammon Esq and in Consideration that
she truly has industry and humor and has made many
years Contribution largely to the support of her family
I give and bequeath to her absolutely and in fee
simple the following property to wit One thousand
Pounds Sterling to be held in the village of New
in said County and to be used by her during her
residence there, the sum so named to be used
and to take a due continuall charge and care
over same to pay other charges & incidental over
and above the same, Maintenance of her Person, &c.,
Her need Meetinge of time places and in the
use of the same, after her death until all my
Estate of my kindred & friends by this Will I
determine disposed of to them and to the other
and to be freely & openly to dispose of as she may
think fit.

Item 3rd I also give and bequeath to my said wife for
and during her natural life the following Negroes
to wit, Happy Mann, Sam'l, Negro Man, Job, Negro
Woman, Anna and Negro Child, all which are
now perfum'd and after her death slaves and
servants and Negroes to my Children to wit
