Lampkin, James M. Lampkin, Miller, G. Lampkin, Charlie, M. Lampkin, Robert, B. Lampkin and Frank Lampkin, - Shall also share alike or in such other way as they may perceive all of them being of age, and capable of acting for themselves. - Should they however disagree in kind very well, but if they cannot agree amongst themselves then the whole to be sold, and the proceeds equally distributed between them.

I hereby nominate and appoint my beloved wife Catherine C. Lampkin Sole executor of this my last Will hereby revoking all others here to fore by me made and it is my pleasure that she be relieved from the trouble of making and returning an inventory of my effects and sum money awarded returning to the Ordinaries of her Actions and claims.
