I James G. Branch of the County and State aforesaid being indisposed, but of sound mind and disposing memory, do make, alter and constitute and declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

Item 1<sup>st</sup>

I command my soul to God, and my body to my family and friends, to be by them buried in a plain decent manner.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup>

I wish my just debts paid.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup>

I have given to my daughter Scott Felt property as per schedule in a book amounting to Nine Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty six ~~100~~ Dollars, which I declare is in full of her share. I have given to Sarah A. Hall My daughter in trust as per schedule in Book property amounting to Nine thousand Eight hundred and fifty Nine Dollars which is in full of her part. I have previously given to my son John James Branch property (including lands which will hereinafter be partitioned) amounting to Nine thousand Nine hundred and Eighty five Dollars. I have previously loaned to David R. Richardson the husband of my daughter Jane as per schedule property amounting to One thousand Two hundred and Seventy four Dollars (in which amount is included land in Clarke County herein after mentioned) the whole of those amounts to each one respectively being in full of each of their respective shares.

Item 4<sup>th</sup>

I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Leigh G. Branch absolutely, and to dispose of she pleases a certain Negro man called Henry or Bob.

Item 5<sup>th</sup>

At My death it is My Will and desire that all my Estate both herein before and herein after bequeathed, of every description remain in the hands of my wife and daughter of my beloved wife during her natural life. No sale of any off my Estate to take place unless it is impossible to pay my debts without it. No appraisement of my Estate or valuation to be made.

Item 6<sup>th</sup>

At the death of my wife I wish my Estate Equally divided by sale & distribution amongst all my Grand Children then in life each Grand Child to receive specifically the same amount.

Item 7<sup>th</sup>

For the purpose of perfecting title I hereby give and bequeath to my son John James Branch Eight hundred Acres of land more or less in Clarke County Georgia being all that lies North West of Freeman's Creek and including the place wherein he now lives and being the land previously mentioned.

Item 8<sup>th</sup>

For the purpose of perfecting title I hereby give and bequeath to David R. Richardson Eight hundred and Eight

Item 9<sup>th</sup>

and three fourth Acre of Land in Clarke County Georgia,  
whereon he now lives this Land to be held by him and  
his family forever. And the Land to my son John James  
Branch to be held in the same manner as fully as  
though I had made them each a Deed of conveyance  
in fee simple.

Item 9<sup>th</sup>

I hereby Nominate Constitute and Appoint my beloved Wife  
Sarah M. Branch and my friend John Calvin Johnson Esq.  
Attorneys and Executrix of this my last Will and Testament.

Eighteen hundred and Sixty One.

aforesaid, do hereby make ordain, publish and declare this  
to be a Codicil to my last Will and Testament.

Item 14<sup>th</sup> Having only loaned, and never given to David R.  
Richardson any property absolutely except in contempla-  
tion of my death, as expressed in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Item of the aforesaid  
Will and Circumstances now rendering it imperatively nec-  
essary, I hereby absolutely and forever revoke the bequest  
to said David R. Richardson, and in lieu thereof, give the  
property therein mentioned to my daughter Jane H. Richardson  
and the children born of her body and all hereafter born  
except the land hereinbefore mentioned which I have sold  
for her use and the use of the children, and the proceeds  
of the sale of the land I apply to her benefit & if land is  
hereafter bought with money, it shall be and considered  
a part of the bequest to her, which I hereby place in trust  
for her and her children born or hereafter to be born as  
aforesaid, and hereby appoint my son in law Another, J.  
Reed Trustee for her other children. Wishing the family  
to have the use of the property, but restraining said  
David R. Richardson from selling or disposing of any  
part thereof. The other provisions of my Will to remain  
unchanged and unrevoked.
