I appoint my beloved Wife Mrs Katharine Demitt
Tumpkins Testamentary Executrix for the person

Tumpkins and also Testamentary Executrix for
any and all other child or children born to us
after issue of our marriage during their minority.

I appoint my Wife Mrs Katharine Demitt
Tumpkins my sole Executrix of this my last
Will and Testament and give her full authority
to carry out all contracts made by me and to
discharge all liabilities against me and to settle
with my brother as Administrator of the Estate of
my Father, Mother and Brothers authorizing
her to exercise a liberal discretion in said settlements.

I believe my Executrix and Testamentary Executrix for
my children my Wife Mrs Katharine Demitt Tumpkins
from making any return to the Court of Ordinary
or other Court during the widowhood of her husband
to file the annual inventory of my Estate.
