mind and disposing memory do make, Retain, Publish
and declare this to be my Last Will and Testament
having revoked all Wills by me heretofore made,

Item 1st I command my soul to God and my body to my family
and friends to be buried in a plain, decent manner.

Item 2nd
Item 3rd I wish all my just debts paid.
As long as my beloved wife Dennis Gray lives, it is my will
and desire, that she have and enjoy all my Estate
real, personal and mixed and I hereby bequeath
the same to her during her natural life.

Item 4th After the death of my beloved wife, it is my will and
desire, that my Estate of every kind be equally divided
between and among my Children Colgate & Strickland
Susan C. Bratton, Jeremiah G. Gray Junr and the
two Children of my son William B. Gray those two
Children to receive a portion of my Estate equal to each
one of my Children, being One fourth part thereof and
if either of those Children should die before my wife
being childless, the part of such child shall go to the
Sisters of said Childless, and if leaving Child or
children to such Child or Children, and if either of my
Children should die as aforesaid their respective Shares to
go to their Children.

Item 5th I hereby witness this Executor hereinafter appointed
from the necessity and duty of making and returning
any Inventory and appraisement of my Estate, or the
making of returns to the Ordinary, next after the death
of my wife.

Item 6th I have by Nominal Constitution and appoint my Sons
Jeremiah G. Gray Junr my Executor to the my last Will
and Testament.

have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this
eleventh day of September in the Year of our Lord one hundred and
seventy five 1875.
