Said State aforesaid being of sound mind and disposing memory, do Make, Reclaim, publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all Wills by me heretofore Made.

Item 1st I commend my Soul to God and my body to my family and friends to be buried in a plain, cheap manner.

Item 2nd I wish all my just debt paid.

Item 3rd As long as my beloved Wife Maria may live, it is my will and desire, that she have use and enjoy all my Estate real, personal and mixed and I hereby bequeath the same to her during her natural life.

Item 4th After the death of my beloved Wife, it is my will and desire, that my Estate of every kind be equally divided between and among my Children Eliza Letitia Strickland Susan G. Broth, Jeremiah G. Gray Junr and the three Children of my son William B. Gray those three Children to receive a portion of my Estate equal to each one of my Children, being one fourth part thereof and if either of those Children should die before my Wife being childless, the part of such child shall go to the Survivors of said Children and if having Child or Children to such Child or Children, and if either of my Children should die as aforesaid their respective Shares to go to their Children.

Item 5th I hereby name my Executor hereinafter appointed from the necessity and duty of making and returning my Inventory and appraisement of my Estate, or the Making of returns to the Ordinary; to wit after the death of my Wife.

Item 6th I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my Son Jeremiah G. Gray Junr Executor to the my last Will and Testament.

I test my Hand, I the said Jeremiah G. Gray Senior have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Eleventh (11th) day of September Eighteen Hundred and Seventy five 1875.
