- Item 5th I do Truly give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth L. Leland an equal share of the Remainder of my Estate not herein otherwise disposed of
- Item 6th I do Truly give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Willson an equal share of the Remainder of my Estate not herein otherwise disposed of
- Item 7th I do Truly give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha M. Muga her own equal share of the Remainder of my Estate not herein otherwise disposed of
- Item 8th I do Truly give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret Hardgrove an equal share of the Remainder of my Estate and also I give and bequeath unto the said daughter a sum of money to wit \$500 in Dollars in Money and to be paid unto her as follows
