Georgia I, Mary, Baxter of said County being
 of said County in feeble health, but of sound and disposing
 mind and memory, do make publish, and
 declare this to be my last Will and Testament.

First - I wish my executors hereinafter named, to pay any debt
 I may have unsettled, as soon as possible after my death.

Second - I direct that my Executors purchase from the Estate of
 my deceased husband, the four acre lot, with the improve-
 ments thereon, on which I now reside, and this house
 and lot together with all the furniture therein which be-
 longs to me, and Kitchen furniture and my carriage, I
 give and bequeath, without inventory or appraisement to
 my daughter Sarah, G. Bird in fee simple as a home for
 herself and children.

Third - I give to my daughters, Sarah G. Bird and Mary, E.
 Gresham, each the sum of ten thousand dollars.

Fourth - The balance of my Estate, both real and personal,
 Bonds, Stocks notes, money or claims in action, and property
 of every description whatever, I give and bequeath subject
 to the limitations hereinafter mentioned, to my six
 children, Andrew Baxter, Mary, E. Gresham, Thomas
 W. Baxter, Sarah, G. Bird, John, S. Baxter, and Richard, B.
 Baxter, share and share alike. The share of Mary, E.
 Gresham, is not to be a separate estate, but is given
 to her husband, John G. Gresham - And the share of
 Andrew Baxter, I give as follows, one fourth of it to his
 son Thomas William Baxter, and one fourth to his
 daughter Alice Baxter, the remaining half to the said
 Andrew Baxter, for and during his natural life, and after
 his death to his children - This half to be given by my
 Executors to him in possession with remainder as afore-
 said.

Fifth - I give power and authority to my Executors to sell
 and convey any part of my real Estate, in Texas, Missis-
 sippi, or elsewhere, without an order of Court, or to divide
 the same if it can be done, and make titles there to
 accordingly.

Sixth - I nominate and appoint my sons John, S. Baxter and
 Richard B. Baxter my Executors, to this my last will and
 Testament - I do sincerely hope, and earnestly request that
 there shall be no trouble or hard feeling among my
 children, in the settlement of my estate, and I commend
 them to God whom I have endeavored sincerely and humbly
 to serve, through Jesus Christ Amen! -
 I hereby revoke all wills heretofore made by me, and in
 witness whereof I have hereunto fixed my hand and seal
 this 14th day of February 1868.

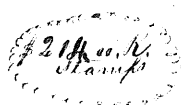
