1st After the payment of my just debts I
will and desire that my property be
equally divided among all of my brother
and sisters a like 1st I wish to make parties
namely Thomas Williams to whom I have
loaned eighteen dollars and Jesse Williams
to whom I have loaned fifty dollars
and William Green to whom I have loaned
twenty five dollars shall have accounted
to and receive to the said sums respecting
that I have loaned them. It being my
meaning and intention that the said sums
that I have loaned them shall be deducted
from the part that is coming to them in
order that all of my brother and sisters
shall stand on an equal footing

I hereby authorize and appoint
my brother Thomas S. Williams my execu-
tor to carry out this my last Will and
Testament
