 writing in town following to wit,

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will give and bequeath to my beloved wife  
 Julia M. Hutchison all that tract of land known  
 as the Secluded Cottage or Dr. Weller's place in said  
 County containing one hundred and six acres more  
 or less, and one hundred Dollars in current  
 money during her life at Woodland, on condition  
 that she accept this bequest in this sum in view  
 of services in my final estate and of her distal  
 talents in my personal property.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I will give and bequeath all other property  
 both real and personal of which I now die in  
 possession at my death to my children, to Margarette  
 & Chapman Hutchinson, Sarah Hutchinson,  
 Mary Ann Abellard Hutchinson, Emerson C. Hutchinson  
 and Robert A. Hutchinson to be equally divided among  
 them.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I nominate and appoint my brother Dr. C.  
 Hutchinson as my Executor if he is alive at my  
 death, otherwise I appoint my son Dr. Weller C.  
 Hutchinson and my son-in-law Major F. Chapman  
 as my Executors.
