 writing in terms following to wit

Item 1st I will give and bequeath to my beloved wife
 Julia M. Nutcherson all that tract of land known
 as the Secluded Cottage or Dr. Nutcherson's place in said
 County containing more or less and also the house
 or shop and one hundred Dollars in current
 money during her life or widowhood, on condition
 that she accept this bequest in this form in lieu
 of Dower in my real estate and of her distributive
 share in my personal property.

Item 2nd I will give and bequeath all other property
 both real and personal of which I am or will
 be possessed at my death to my children viz Margaret
 & Elphinstone Virginia Nutcherson, Edward Nutcherson,
 Mary Ann Abella Nutcherson, Joseph Nutcherson
 and Robert A. Nutcherson to be equally divided among
 them.

Item 3rd I nominate and appoint my brother Dr. D. D.
 Nutcherson as my Executor if he is in life at my
 death. otherwise I appoint my son Edward C.
 Nutcherson and my son in law James C. Clagburn
 as my Executors
