said property for their children at their death ninthly
they are to have full power and control over it at their
mothers death and this Item of my will is not a be
gavet as to the offspring of the said Jack and Jim
Gray but merely a direction to them.

It is my will and desire that Nelson McCombs shall be
my Executor, but it shall not be his duty to make or have
made any appraisement of my property or make any
return to the Court of Probate, he shall not be required
to give any bond or be liable in any way as my
Executor.
