 It is my will and desire, and in accordance therewith I do
 hereby bequeath to Sallie Ware, for and during her natural
 life, my house and lot situated in the City of Athens and
 deeded to me by Benjamin Phillips, and also all my
 household and kitchen furniture, One note in West Chinas,
 and all other property of which I may be possessed at my
 death, At the death of the said Sallie it is my will and desire
 and I hereby bequeath all the property above described to
 the two children, to wit Jack Ware and Jim Ware.

I enjoy upon the said Jack and Jim Ware to keep the
 said property so their children at their death nevertheless
 they are to have full power and control over it at their
 mother's death and this I give of my Will is not a be-
 quest as to the offspring of the said Jack and Jim
 Ware but merely a direction to them.

It is my Will and desire that Nelson McCrumb shall be
 my Executor, but it shall not be his duty to make or have
 made any appraisement of my property or make any
 returns to the Court of Chancery. He shall not be re-
 quired to give any bond or be liable in any way as my
 Executor.
