

land one horse one cow and calf one sow & pigs

beside notes which I hold against him for advances
Jesse Hanson has received from me for his wife Matilda
one negro girl Sall one horse one cow & calf one
hundred and forty acres of land one sow & pigs One cow
& Lamb One bed Bedstead & furniture besides notes
on him also for advances My daughter Martha has received
Only one negro girl Ann the bed and furniture having
been made by herself she is set to account for it

At the death of my wife, after my decease, or if it should
outlive her at my death it is my will and desire that the
whole of my Estate be divided between my son John White
My daughter Matilda Hanson and my daughter Martha
Martha to receive each one to account for what they have
already received so that each may be equal of the share of
the division of my Estate and if Matilda Hanson should
be dead at the happenings of the above except then her
children to come in and occupy the portion she would if
living by drawing lots share

I wish no appriment of my estate to be sold in
any way during the life of my wife but the payment
to be made when the time of the succession
