 into the service of the County, the Confederate States of America, as a
 Voluntary Soldier knowing the uncertainty of life at home or abroad
 in peace or in War, do make this my last Will and Testament.

Item 1st I wish all my just debts paid as soon as practical after my death.

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved Father and Mother William M.
 Jones and Mary Jones for and during their natural lives unto their
 services of third for one during his or her natural life, My interest in
 same being one undivided half of Three hundred and fifty Acres of
 land, out where they now live. And unto my said Father for and
 Nine hundred Dollars, My Horse and buggy and all and any other
 property that I may hereafter acquire and possess at any time after this death
 to go to and be equally divided among my three Sisters Louisa C.
 McMillan, Clementine C. Jones and Amanda C. J. Jones.

Item 3rd If after my death my said Father should think it best to sell my
 said interest in said land, he is hereby authorized to do so either at
 public or private sale as he may deem best and I also give him
 the same authority in relation to my horse buggy and the proceeds
 of such sale or sales to be subject to and be disposed of according to the
 provisions of the Second item of this Will.

Item 4th I nominate and appoint my Father William M. Jones Executor
 of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand & seal, this
 1st day of Feb.

In witness whereof, I have signed and declared
 in my own free and lawful mind and intention in
 the presence of each of the undersigned witnesses
 and at his house.
