Sensible of the uncertainty of life, and the certainty of death do
make Andam prolish and declare this to be my last will
and Testament. - Do Wit.

I Will that all my just debts be paid.
It is my Will that all my Property both Real and Personal
shall be held, Controlled, and enjoyed by my Wife Catherine
Dunsley during her natural life as long as she may
remain a Widow, hereby Conveying upon my said Wife
the right, and Power during her Widowhood, & if she does
not marry again during her life to give off to such of
my Children as may marry, or become of age such
property as she shall think fit taking care not to deprive
my Wife of which may be necessary for her own support, and
not giving to any one of them more than an
equal share with my other Children in my Estate. -

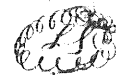
If my Wife Catherine shall marry again it is my
Will that upon her second marriage my Estate shall be
Sold or divided as my Executors may think best and an
equal division of the same made between my said Wife
and all of my Children share & share alike each Child
being prepared to account for any advancement made
If my Wife should not marry again then it is my Will
that at her death an equal division of my Estate by private
or public Sale between my Children share having
received any advancements from my Wife to account for
the same is a final division of my Estate. -

I Will that should my Wife die or marry again before
all of my Children shall become of age that a Comptanting
be set apart by Executors for the Support, & Education of such
minor Child, or Children until they become of age the same
not to be accounted for out their part of my Estate in a
final division. -

I hereby nominate and appoint Robert Dunsley
Andrew B. Dunsley my eldest Son, and William Hope
Kull all of Clarke County Georgia Executors to this my
last Will and Testament, & said W^m D. Dunsley to be retained
as the legal Adviser, & Counsiler for my family, &c -
