view of the fact that I am about to depart in the
present War in which our Country is involved with the
United States Government, do hereby make and publish
this as my last Will and Testament.
- Item 1st Having the most perfect confidence in my beloved
Wife Vera E. Delany and knowing that she will do
justice to my little children I give and bequeath unto
my said Wife Vera E. Delany all my Estate both real
and personal of which I may die possessed.
- Item 2nd I recommend to her to pay my debts with the
money due by her father to herself and me in that
year 1863 and if that be insufficient to add thereto
the money arising from the interest and sale, I have
bequeathed and by no means should I advise the
sale of any property until our Independence be achieved
and the State of the Country settled.
- Item 3 I further recommend to her that she take for home
in Athens, a Mother, without a house can never raise
her children properly.
- Item 4 My beloved Son I desire shall be given to his share
of my lands who will best appreciate them, my last
beloved son let him be sold.
- Item 5 I fully recommend and appoint my said Wife Vera
E. Delany Executor of this my last Will and Testament.
