I William H. Guber of the County and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of life do make Ordain publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament hereby Revo-
 king all other Wills by me heretofore made

I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body to my Family and friends to be buried in a decent Christianlike manner.

Item 1st I wish all my just debts to be paid as soon as practical after my death

Item 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Mary Guber for and during her natural life all my Estate Real Person or mixed and all my Estate of every description and after her death to be disposed of as follows. viz.

Item 3rd I give and bequeath to my Daughter Louisa Shelton wife of Lewis Shelton and after her death to her children now born or that may hereafter be born, the following negroes with the increase of the females from and after the date of this Will Hetty a woman and her child Harriet and a boy named Taylor said negroes to be counted to my said Daughter and her children whenever paid out of my Estate at the following prices to wit said Woman Hetty and child Harriet and their increase as above defined at the price of Eleven Hundred Dollars and said boy Taylor at the price of Nine Hundred Dollars

Item 4th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Clementine b. Guber the following negroes to wit Scott a boy and Ann a Girl with the increase of said Girl from and after the date of this Will said negroes to be counted to my said Daughter Clementine whenever she receives them at the following prices to wit said boy Scott at seven Hundred Dollars and said Girl Ann and her increase as above defined at four Hundred Dollars

Item 5th I give and bequeath to my Daughter Amanda b. E. G. Guber the following negroes to wit Judge a boy and Jane a Girl with the increase of said Girl Jane from and after the date of this Will said negroes to be counted to my said Daughter Amanda b. G. whenever she receives them at the following prices to wit said boy Judge at Three Hundred Dollars and said Girl Jane and her increase as above defined at One Hundred Dollars

Item 6th I give and bequeath to my two Daughters Clementine C. Guber and Amanda E. G. Guber all the Tract of land wherein I now live containing about three hundred and seventy Acres together with all my perishable property except the Horses and Mules said Land and perishable property to be counted to them whenever they Receive the same at Twenty Two Hundred Dollars

Item 7th I give and bequeath to my before named three Daughters all my negroes not herein before named all my Horses and Mules and any and all other property of which I may die seized and possessed and not herein before disposed of to be divided among them by agreement or by public or private Sale or otherwise as they may think best so as to make them all equal shares in my Estate from the beginning that is taking into the account what each may have received before that time as in the next and foregoing Item of this Will directed The portion falling to my Daughter Louise C. Shelton in this division or any portion she may Receive from my Estate in accordance with the provisions of the next and following Item of this Will I give and bequeath to her and her children in the same way and in the same terms as the negroes given them in and by the Third Item of this my Will.

Item 8th If any or all of the specific legacies herein before bequeathed to any of my said Daughters should be delivered to them during my life or after my death during the life of my wife which she is hereby authorized to do if she thinks best such Daughters or Daughters must in the division provided for in the seventh Item of this Will account for the property so Received at the prices herein before affixed to such property and any other property that I may give off to any of them during my life or that my wife may give off to them after my death which she is hereby authorized to do if she thinks best must be accounted for in said division by those receiving it at the price fixed on it by myself or Wife at the time of giving same and if no price be then fixed then at what price such property was worth at the time it was Received.

Item 9th If any of my said Daughters shall die before the division provided for in the 7th Item of this Will takes place then the survivor or survivors of them are hereby authorized to make the same the share of the deceased in said division if it by my Daughter Louise C. Shelton to go to her and her children as herein before provided & if it be either of the others to go to their surviving sister equally or to whoever they or either of them may Will it provided they or either of them die leaving

no child or children but in the event of leaving child or children then to go to such child or children as provided in the case of Lewis to the like.

Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my wife Mary Gorer and my Daughters Clementine C. Gorer and Amanda E. G. Gorer Executresses of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 21st day of January 1869.
