My Soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it as I hope for eternal life and salvation through the merits and atonement of the blessed Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ whose Religion I have professed and as I humbly trust have enjoyed for forty five years

2nd Item I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay by my executors herein after appointed, as I am unwilling my creditors should be delayed in their rights especially as there is no necessity for delay

3^d Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Emily Brown all my Rail Road Stock consisting of nine shares in the Montgomery Rail Road in Alabama to be used as she may think proper and free from the disposition of her present or future husband

4th Item I give and bequeath to my Grandson William White son of my daughter Harriet of the sum of two hundred dollars

5th Item I desire and direct that all my property of every description both real and personal be sold to the highest bidder and the proceeds of said sale to be equally divided between all my legal heirs including my beloved wife Elizabeth with whom I have lived in the strictest quiet for the last ten years

6th Item I hereby constitute and appoint G W Barber and John Kirkpatrick Executors of this my last will and testament this 30th day of January 1863

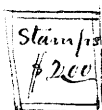
