I Asbury Hull of said County do make and declare this to be my last will and testament.

Item 1st As much as my beloved wife Maria is sufficiently provided for by a marriage settlement executed between us before marriage I do not provide & will that the sum of fifty shares of the Capital Stock of the Georgia Rail Road & Banking Company shall be set apart during her life and the dividends thereof as declared & made to be paid to her. At her death the said shares shall revert to my estate and be divided in the same manner as the rest of my estate and this provision for my wife is declared to be in lieu and stead of dower.

Item 2nd It is my will that the remainder of my estate both real & personal (as well as the above named shares subject to the above provision) be equally divided among my children that is to say, the advance ment heretofore made or which may hereafter be made to any of them shall be brought into hotch-pot according to the rules provided by law in case of intestacy and the estate shall be so divided so that all may be made equal including said advancements made or to be made.

Item 3 I declare that the following sums in money & property have up to this date been advanced to my children respectively, and it is my will that they be so estimated to wit:

To William Hope Hull	Ten Thousand dollars
To Henry Hull	Twelve Thousand dollars
To George G. Hull	Eleven Thousand dollars
To John H. Hull	Ten Thousand dollars
To Edward W. Hull	Thirteen Thousand dollars
To James M. Hull	Twelve Thousand five hundred dollars

Item 4th The above sums are set down in figures on the next page and it is my intention to write on said page or elsewhere on this will whatever sums may hereafter be advanced which it is my will may also be taken & held as the evidence of such advancements.

Item 5th I appoint my sons William Hope and Henry as the Executors of this my will.
