publicly and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament hereby revoking all
wills by me heretofore made,

Item 1st. I give and bequeath to my son John
Branch of Greene County Georgia as Brother and
my trust to Sarah James Parrson the daughter
of my Grand Son George A M Parrson the
sum of One Thousand Dollars in Cash to be
paid out of my Estate, One Bedstead
Bed and furniture, One Bureau, my Dressing and
wearing apparel, the sum of One Thousand
Dollars as aforesaid to bear interest from my
death, and the principal and interest accruing
thereon to be paid by said Trustee John Branch
to said Sarah and Parrson on her marriage or
attaining to her full age, or at her discretion she
may as she shall deem proper to command apply
the said accruing interest towards her education
or clothing, the other articles to be delivered to
George A M Parrson at my death for his
private use,

Item 2nd. The Residue is bequeathed of my Estate
whenever consisting of property Cash or to note
and secured a Power of Attorney which equally divided
between or among all my Children living at
my death and the heirs of those who may
be dead; my Grand Children to trust what
their father or mother would be entitled to
if living, except my Grand Son George
A M Parrson who is not to have any
share or portion of my estate whatever
Item 3rd. I hereby nominate constitute and appoint
my son John Branch Executor of the Will
