Consideration of the sum of five hundred dollars, lawful
money, to the said James Hendon Sheriff in hand well
and truly paid, at and before the sealing and delivery of these
presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted,
bargained and sold, and by these presents do grant, bargain and
sell unto the said William Matthews his heirs and assigns, all
that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County and
State aforesaid, in Tract and Containing four hundred acres more
or less, granted to buying and bounding as follows, joining Jackson
Davis, Matthews & others, levied on & sold as the property of Ann
Millidge & John Millidge as tenants in Common by Virtue of two
Orders from Richmond Superior Court in favor of Beck & Dearings
Ann Millidge, and Beck & Dearings (by John Millidge levied on by
Virtue of Executions issued out of the Superior Court of the County of
Richmond in the said State, bearing date the thirty first day of
March, Eighteen hundred and forty three and duly advertised for
