late of Baldwin County dec'd by Jesse Robinson Exr.

Georgia Superior Court Sitting for ordinary purposes,
Baldwin County Summary Term 1856.

Jesse Robinson Exr of Zachariah Lamar, dec'd late of Baldwin County in said State having proven the Last Will & Testament of said Dec'd and having returned the Inventory & appraisment to the said Court of Baldwin & having also obtained leave & an order from said Court of Baldwin to remove his executorship to this County in terms of the Statute.

It is on Motion, ordered that the Will of said Dec'd together with the proceedings of said Court of Baldwin & the return of said Exr be recorded in this Court & said Exr hereafter make returns of his proceedings to this Court.

Georgia In the name of God, Amen
Zachariah Lamar of the County of Baldwin and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind memory, do make, ordain publish and declare this to be my last Will and Testament revoking all others.

Item and clause first. I give bequeath and devise unto Lucius L. C. Lamar of the County of Baldwin, and Jesse Robinson of the County of Jefferson, and the survivor of them as trustees for my beloved son John Basil Lamar the real and personal property in this clause hereinafter to be mentioned, subject to the trust, limitation, condition and restriction hereinafter to be declared. To wit, all my plantations and real estate in Bibb County lying east of the Ocmulgee River together with tractions number one hundred and sixty two on the Ocmulgee river in Twiggs County containing two hundred and eleven acres total including the fraction of seven five thousand one hundred and sixty two acres, also the negroes hereinafter mentioned, to wit, Old Charles, Jerry, Melinda, Gabe, Joshua, Mema, Randall, Williams, Young Charles, Selah, Walker, Phil & Phoebe his wife, Philip, Lucinda, John (son of Phil) Augustus, Gabriel, Mary & her child Leacy, Ned, Sam, Herbert, Nancy his wife, Samuel, Sarah Ann (child of Sam Herbert), Abram Blacksmith, Clarissa his wife, Louisa, Sam, Squire, Sarah, Martha, Fickie (son of Squire), Sarah Squire child, Isaac, Billy Bird, Grace Lucy, Billy (son of Billy Bird) Lety (daughter of Billy Bird), Solomon, John (son of my son), Mat, Venus, Mark, Phillis, for Susan his wife, Robin, Polly, Armstrong, George Francis Elijah, Ned (carpenter), African Peter, Fanny his wife, Sam, Simon, Andrew, Hamilton, Peter Hammett his wife, Edmough, Sally, Greeter, Adelaide, Beck, child of Big Flora, William, Vincy (daughter of Squire) and the future increase of the negroes aforesaid, also eighteen mules & all the stock of Cattle & Hogs, Blacksmith's tools, plantation utensils & carriages, at the plantation hereinafter mentioned, together with all the provision, corn, fodder &c which may be thereon at my decease. All the property aforesaid real & personal to be held by the said trustees & the survivor

of them, in trust for the sole use, benefit & enjoyment of my said son John B Lamar until he shall have arrived at the age of twenty five years, the said John B Lamar to have the management, use & enjoyment of the said property & the proceeds thereof, until he shall have arrived at the age aforesaid, but if at any time the said John B Lamar contrary to my ardent hope, expectations & in violation of his solemn promises & sacred duty shall addict himself to the destructive vice of Gaming then and in that case, it shall be in the power of my said trustees & the survivor of them, to take the management & control of said property into their own hands so far as it may be necessary to do so to prevent its waste and destruction. It is my further will and desire that when my John B Lamar shall have arrived at the age aforesaid, the property aforesaid shall cease to be held in trust as aforesaid, but the legal title in and to the same shall at that period rest in the said John B Lamar as fully and as officially as it is now vested in said trustee; provided the said John B Lamar in the intermediate time, shall have abstained from the practice of gaming otherwise the legal title aforesaid shall continue in the said trustee, subject to the trust aforesaid, until he shall have clearly shown by his conduct a total and permanent abandonment of that practice. It is my further will and desire, that if my said son John B Lamar shall die at this life, without leaving a legitimate child or children, living at the time of his death, then and in that event the property aforesaid shall rest in my children, Mary Ann Lamar & Andrew Jackson Lamar.. to be equally divided between them & I hereby bequeath & devise the same to them accordingly provided that, some should happen

Thus I bequeath & devise unto Lucius J. C. Lamar, & wife Robinson & the survivor of them as trustees for my beloved daughter Mary Ann Lamar, and such child or children as she may have living at the time of her death, the real & personal estate hereinafter mentioned - to wit: My hammock plantation and adjoining lands in the County of Baldwin containing Twenty four hundred & thirty six acres; also the following negroes - to wit: Louis, Nancy his wife, Kelly, Elizabeth Odia, (children of Saml) Ellick, and Clarence his wife, & their three child, Ben, Robinson and Patty his wife, & their five children, to wit, Rhody, Fleming, Minnie Ann, & Abby, Jeffrey, Rhina & her two children Madrick and Ellick, Saml (son of Lewis) Abram & Melly his wife, & their child Melkey, Jos a blacksmith, Lucy his wife, October his wife his wife, & their five children, to wit, Paddy, James, Tom, Albert, & Daniel, May & Ester his wife, & their four children, Maria, Paul, Betty, & Pleasant, Edmund, & Bessy his wife, & their three children to wit, Ambrose, Minty, Welter, Simon & his wife Peggy & their two children. Martha & Charles, Isaac & Harriette his wife & their child Mel Elson, James & Sibby, his wife & their two children Caroline & Isabella, Peggy & her two children, to wit, James Cherry, Levi & Ben ^{sons} Chas. W. ^{sons} Becky, their sister Margaret & their two children, Rowen & his brother Andrew, Moses & Melkey, Juliana, Rowen, her sister, James, &

Use sixteen Mules & one lot of cattle, hogs, blacksmith tools
& plantation utensils & equipment at the said Hurricane plantation,
together with all the provisions corn fodder &c. which may be
there at my decease, the said timber, to have & to hold the
property aforesaid, real & personal, in trust for the sole use
benefit & enjoyment of my said daughter Mary Ann Samar
during her natural life and at and after her death for the sole use
benefit & enjoyment of each child or children as she may have
living at the time of her death to be equally divided between
such children, And in the event that she shall depart this
life without leaving any child or children living at the time
of her death, then and in that case I give bequeath & devise the
property aforesaid to my son John B Samar & Andrew Jackson
Samar their heirs to be equally divided between them.

Item Clause third: I do hereby give bequeath & devise unto my beloved
son Andrew Jackson Samar this my land in Bibb County
West of the Ockmulgee River containing one thousand two hundred
thirty two acres, to wit: one hundred & thirty three
three hundred & thirty three acres, to wit: one hundred & thirty three
three hundred & thirty three acres, to wit: one hundred & thirty three
in the fifth District of Bibb County, also lots two, four, six, eight
& thirty six & four hundred & thirty seven containing two hundred
sixty seven acres. Also lots two hundred & forty one, four hundred
& forty two, four hundred & forty three, four hundred & forty four
& four hundred & forty five containing five hundred & thirty one
acres; all said lots being situated lying on the Chattahoochee
River in the County of Bibb, State of Georgia, also Section
thirty Section nineteen, also part of Section eighteen West half
of Section seven, South half of Section eight, containing twenty two
hundred acres of land situated &c. in Township Sixteen
Range Sixteen, in new Land Office for meridian Montgomery
County in the State of Alabama, also the following negroes
to wit, Young Mark, Young Frank, Calie, daughter of Annetta Mary
(by Thomas Child) Bolie & Selma. The future increase of the said
female negroes, also one undivided share of State Bank
stock now held by me, the sum of ten thousand dollars in money
to be raised as hereinafter mentioned. And in case my son Andrew
Jackson Samar shall depart this life without leaving a child
or children living at the time of his death, then & in that
case I give bequeath & devise the property real & personal aforesaid
to my son John B Samar & my daughter Mary Ann
Samar, to be equally divided between them.
It is my will & desire that my son Andrew Jackson Samar shall
receive a liberal education at any eligible institution in the State
of Georgia. And I hereby nominate constitute and appoint George
J B Samar & Jesse Robinson Guardians of the person and estate of
my sons John B Samar & Andrew Jackson Samar, until they
arrive at the age of twenty one years, & of my daughter
Mary Ann Samar until her marriage.

Item Clause fourth It is my will and desire that all the residue of my estate real & personal & Bankstock not already devised & bequeathed, shall be sold by my Executors, according to law, and after the payment of the pecuniary bequests to my son Andrew Jackson Lamar mentioned out of the proceeds of said sale and all necessary expenses attendant upon the execution of this Will, then the remainder with all the ready money which I may have in hand & in debt & debts due to me at that time shall be equally divided among my sons John Lamar, Mary Ann Lamar & Andrew Jackson Lamar.

Item Clause fifth. It is my further will and desire that in the event of the death of both of my trustees mentioned in the first & second clauses of this will, that Jefferson Lamar of the County of Henry & William Robinson of Alachua Florida, and the survivor of them shall in that event act as trustees, for the purposes in said clauses mentioned and two or more hereby nominated as such and invested in that event with all the powers vested in the original trustee.

Item Clause sixth. It is my will and desire that the residue of my lands in Alabama not devised, shall also be sold by my Executors according to law & the proceeds divided among my children as directed in clause fourth.

Item Seventh, Lastly, I hereby nominate constitute & appoint my friends and relations Leckus L. Lamar and John H. Lamar Executors of my last will and testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & thirty two.

 twenty two acres in original title the fourteenth District of Wilkinson
 County, also four fractions on Palmetto Creek containing five
 hundred & twenty one acres in Sandy Creek Pine lands, also two
 hundred & two & half acres of land in Lawrence County also two
 fractions containing two hundred & two acres on the Coosa River
 in the Second District of Wilkinson County, also five hundred
 fifty five acres of land on Black Creek including a moiety of the
 old Mill and Mill seat, formerly belonging to Anderson in
 Wilkinson County, also one house and lot in the town of Milledgeville
 situate on Main Street between Wiley & Baxter's large corner building
 & the State Bank, also one lot of one hundred one in
 original title of the same town of Milledgeville situate on Wilkinson
 Street,

I do also give now and I give unto James B. Lamar & son

 And I do also give now and I give unto my said daughter

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Mary Ann Lamar, without limitations or restrictions the following real estate, viz, All such lands lying being in the County of Howards Dooley, Brown & Early not heretofore bequeathed or devised of which I may be possessed but the time of my death (except majority in the fifth District of Houston County) Also lot number two hundred forty one in the second District of Monroe, Also number four in the square number twenty three, on Jefferson Street, Also one quarter and lot number one, in square forty four on Franklin Street, Also the corner half or lot number two, square forty three, situate on the corner of Franklin & Maynard Streets, and all the buildings thereon all lying and being in the town of Milledgeville.

Item Third, I will devise the same unto my beloved son Andrew Jackson Lamar the following negroes additional to his legacy in my last will & testament aforesaid, viz Susan child of old James Mingo son of old Mingo, Suzie daughter of August, Sam daughter of William Henry & Ghent children of Cyrus, Also ten additional sums of ten thousand dollars, Also fifteen hundred & fifty acres of land lying east & west of the Oconee River in Baldwin County State aforesaid, being my old Cedar Shoals plantation, also lot number forty in the fifth District of Houston County, containing two hundred & two half acres of land And it is my will & desire that my son Andrew Jackson Lamar's legacy in money to be raised as provided in my last will & testament, by the sale of property not bequeathed & debts that may be due to me shall be raised by my executors, his guardians, or good Bank Stock, or loaned out at legal interest and secured by bond & mortgage on valuable landed property. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this twenty second day of May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & thirty two.
