Proceedings on the estate of Zachariah Lamar  
late of Baldwin County dec'd by Jeptha Robinson Esq.

Georgia S Inferior Court Sitting for ordinary purposes,  
Baldwin County January Term 1806.

Jeptha Robinson Esq of Zachariah Lamar deceased late of  
Baldwin County in said State having given the last Will  
& Testament of said Dec'd and having returned the Inventory  
& appraisement to the said Court of Baldwin & having also ob-  
tained leave & an order from said Court of Baldwin to remove  
his executorship to this County in terms of the Statute.

It is on Motion, ordered that the Will of said Dec'd together  
with the proceedings of said Court of Baldwin & the returns  
of said Executor be recorded in this Court & said Executor hereafter make  
returns of his proceedings to this Court.

Georgia In the name of God Amen  
Baldwin County I, Zachariah Lamar of the County of Baldwin  
and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing  
mind memory, do make, ordain publish and declare this to be  
my last Will and Testament revoking all others.

Item and clause first. I give bequeath and devise unto Lucas  
J. C. Lamar of the County of Baldwin, and Jeptha Robinson of the  
County of Jefferson, and the survivor of them as trustees for my  
beloved son John Basil Lamar the real and personal property  
as this clause hereinafter to be mentioned, subject to the trust,  
limitation, condition and restriction herein after to be declared  
to wit, all my plantations and real estate in Bibb County lying east  
of the Ocmulgee River together with fraction number one hundred  
and sixty two on the Ocmulgee river in Twiggs County contain-  
ing two hundred and eleven acres total including the fraction aforesaid  
Six thousand one hundred and sixty two acres, also the negroes  
hereinafter mentioned, to wit, Old Charles, Somy, Melinda, Caesar,  
Joshua, Memphis, Randall, Julian, Young Charles, Seab, Walker,  
Phil & Phoebe his wife, Philip, Lucinda, John (son of Phil) Augustus,  
Gabriel Mary & her child Lacey, Ned, Sam, Herbert, Nancy his  
wife, Samuel, Sarah and child of Sam, Herbert, Brown Blacksmith,  
Clarissa his wife, Louisa, Tom, Seipie, Sarah, Matthew, Seib, son of the  
Seipie, Sarah, Seipie child, Isiah, Billy Bird, Grace Lucy, Billy  
(son of Billy Bird), Lucy daughter of Billy Bird, Linonette, John, son of  
Lucy Bird, Matt, Versus, Clark, Phyllis, for Susanna his wife, Robin, Polly  
Strong, George Francis Elijah, Ned, carpenter, African Peter, Young  
his wife, David, Simon, Andrew, Hamilton, Peter Ottamette his wife,  
Edenborough, Valley, Frederic, Adelinde, Beck child of Big Flomallie  
Ezra, Vinny (daughter of Seipie) and the future increases of the aforesaid  
aforementioned, also eighteen miles & all the stock of cattle, hogs, Blasts  
smiths tools, plantation utensils & carriages, at the plantation herein  
aforesaid, together with all the provision, corn, fodder &c  
which may be thereon at my decease. All the property aforesaid  
real personal to be held by the said trustees & the survivor

of them, in trust for the sole use, benefit & enjoyment of my said son John B Lamar until he shall have arrived at the age of twenty four years, the said John B Lamar to have the management & government of the said property, & the proceeds thereof, until he shall have arrived at the age aforesaid, but if at any time the said John B Lamar contrary to my ardent hope, expectation & in violation of his solemn promises & sacred duty shall addit himself to the destructive vice of Gaming then and in that case, it shall be in the power of my said trustee & the survivor of them to take the management & control of said property into their own hands so far as it may be necessary to do so to prevent its waste and destruction. It is my further will and desire that when my fourth son shall have arrived at the age aforesaid, the property aforesaid shall cease to be held in trust as aforesaid, but the legal title in and to the same shall at that period rest in the said John B Lamar, as fully and as effectually as it is now vested in said trustee; Provided the said John B Lamar in the intermediate time, shall have abstained from the practice of gaming otherwise the legal title aforesaid shall continue in the said trustee, subject to the trust aforesaid, until he shall have clearly shown by his conduct a total and permanent abandonment of that practice. It is my further will and desire that if my said son John B Lamar shall die at this life, without leaving a legitimate child or children, living at the time of his death, then and in that event the property aforesaid shall rest in my children, Mary Ann Lamar & Andrew Jackson Lamar, to be equally divided between them & I hereby bequeath to leave the same to them accordingly provided that none should happen

I now bequeath Second. I give bequeath & devise unto Lucy L. Lamar & wife Robinson & the survivor of them as trustees for my beloved daughter Mary Ann Lamar, and such child or children as she may have living at the time of her death, the real personal estate hereinafter mentioned to wit, My hurricane plantation and adjoining lands in the County of Baldwin containing Seventy four hundred & thirty six acres; also the following Negroes - to wit Lewis, Nancy his wife, Nelly, Elizabeth Delia, (children of Lewis) Click, and Cleopas his wife, & four other child, Ben, Robinson and Patty his wife, & their five children, to wit, Rhody, Fleming, Henry, Ann, & Abby, Jeffrey, Rhina & her two children, the child and Click, Sarah, (son of Lewis) Abram & Abby his wife, & their child Melony, for a blacksmith, Lucy his wife, Octoby his wife his wife & their five children, to wit, Abby, Jane, Tom, Elbert, & Daniel, Mary & Carter his wife, other four children, Maria, Igat, Betty, Pleasant, Edmund, & Bossey his wife, & their three children to wit, Abraham, Minty, Walter, Simon & his wife & their two children, Martha & Charles, Isaac & Marcella his wife & their child Almon, James & Abby, his wife & their two children Caroline & Isabella, Piggy their two children, to wit, Anna, Cherry, Levi, & Ben, Baldwin, Anna, Beekie, their sister to wit, Abby her sister, Harriet, their brother & their mother Miller, Julian, Rosina, her sister, Fanny,

Also eighteen Males & one female stock of cattle, hogs, blacksmith tools & plantation utensils & carriages at the said Hurricane plantation, together with all the personal property & furniture which may be thereon at my decease, the said trustees to have the sole & property aforementioned, real & personal, in trust for the sole use benefit & enjoyment of my said daughter Mary Ann Lamar during her natural life and at her death for the sole use benefit & enjoyment of such child or children as she may have living at the time of her death to be equally divided between such children, and in the event that she shall depart this life without leaving any child or children living at the time of her death, then and in that case I give bequeath & devise the property aforesaid to my son John S. Lamar & Andrew Jackson Lamar & their heirs to be equally divided between them.

Item Holacee third. I, as I aforesaid and desired, make my beloved son Andrew Jackson Lamar this being all my land in Pitt County West of the Oakmalquin River containing one thousand two hundred & twenty two acres less, etc. The land is in one tract three hundred & twenty five acres & contains two & one-half three hundred & twenty five acres & one-half acre lying on the Challehoccoe River in the fifth District of Pitt County. Also lots not over hundred & thirty six & four hundred & thirty seven containing two hundred & sixty seven acres. Also lots two hundred & forty one, four hundred & forty two, four hundred & forty three, four hundred & forty four & four hundred & forty five containing five hundred & thirty one acres; all said lots in section eighteeen lying on the Challehoccoe River in the tenth section of Pitt County. Also section thirty section thirteen & part of section eighteen west half of section seven, South half of section twelve, containing twenty two hundred acres of land situated & used in connection with their range sixteen, in now known as Creek for miles. Montgomery County in the State of Alabama. Also the following negroes town, Young Clark, Young Frank Baker, daughter of Dennis Mary big Hora's child) Baker & Eliza & the future increase of the said primary negroes. Also one hundred shares of stock want stock now held by me, also four thousand dollars or money to be raised as hereinafter mentioned. And in case my son Andrew Jackson Lamar shall depart this life without leaving a child or children living at the time of his death, then & in that case I give, bequeath & command the property real & personal & personal effects to my son John Lamar & my daughter Mary Ann Lamar, to be equally divided between them.

It is my will & desire that my son Andrew Jackson Lamar shall receive a liberal education at any eligible institution in the State of Georgia. And I hereby nominate, constitute and appoint George H. Lamar & wife Robinson guardians of the person and estate of my sons John B. Lamar & Andrew Jackson Lamar, until they arrive at the age of twenty one years. & of my daughter Mary Ann Lamar until her marriage.

Item & clause fourth It is my will and desire that all the residue of my whole real & personal & Bank Stock not already divided & appropriated, &c. &c. &c. my Executors, according to law, shall after the payment of the pecuniary debts to my son Andrew Lamar & his wife before mentioned out of the proceeds of said Sale, and all money & funds attendant upon the execution of this Will, then the remainder with all the ready money which I may have in hand & in trust & debts due to me at that time shall be equally between my sons John Lamar, Mary Ann Lamar & Andrew Jackson Lamar.

Item & clause fifth. It is my further will and desire that in the event of the death of both of my trustees named and numbered the first & second clauses of this will, that Jeffreath L Lamar of the County of Leon & William Johnson of West Florida, and the survivor of them shall in that case act as trustees, for the purposes in said clauses mentioned and two or hasty nominated as such and invested in that case with all the powers vested in the original trustees.

Item & clause sixth. It is my will and desire that the residue of my lands in Alabama (not diversed) shall also be sold by my executors according to law & the proceeds divided among my children as directed in clause fourth.

Item seventh, Lastly, I hereby nominate Constitution & upon my friends and relatives Lucas L Lamar and John Johnson Executors to this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty third day of January in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred & thirty two.

 thirty two. Give account and I will unto Eliza C. Lamar of the

 states aforesaid and the sum over of them as trustees for my beloved

 legacy in my last will and testament above mentioned

 Hercules, Flora his wife & other children London & Nancy others  
 increase for the son I ever brought my segment of my said son John B.  
 Lamar under the like limitations and restrictions as prescribed in  
 Item and Clause first of my last will and testament aforesaid  
 And I do also give & be unto my said son  
 John B. Lamar without limitations or restrictions the following real estate  
 viz; one tract of land of one hundred & sixteen acres on the Etowah River,  
 also one hundred & sixteen acres of land same granted to James  
 Roseau living in now Fulton County & one hundred & six acres of  
 land on the Etowah River & one Stone Creek in Braswell the twenty  
 fourth District of Williamson also two fractions containing three  
 hundred & ten acres on the Etowah River in Braswell, the  
 fourteenth District of Williamson County also two fractions two hundred  
 & twenty two acres in Braswell the fourteenth District of Williamson  
 County. Also four fractions on Pelmette Creek containing five  
 hundred & twenty one acres in DeKalb County Pine Lake. Also two  
 hundred & two & half acres of land in Lawrence County also two  
 fractions containing two hundred & two acres on the Conasauga River  
 in the Second District of Williamson County, also five hundred  
 & fifty five acres of land on Black Creek including a majority of the  
 old Mill and Mill seat, for miles belonging to Standard in  
 Williamson County. Also one house also lot in the town of Hilliardville  
 situated on Main street between City & Baxter's large corner building  
 the State Bank. To the sum of one hundred and  
 twenty five thousand dollars & odd number one in  
 hundred, due and owing to Eliza C. Lamar & her  
 children aforesaid and for my son as trustee for my  
 beloved daughter Mary Ann & Anna the following negro  
 additional to her in my last will & testament aforesaid  
 me, Frank Charley his wife, George Mary his wife & other children  
 while Rosella, Heron, Loring his wife other children Emanuel and  
 Anderson, from their child Solomon, Dennis & their future increase  
 to the son I ever brought my segment of my said daughter Mary  
 Ann Lamar. Under the like limitations and restrictions as prescribed  
 in Item & Clause the second of my last will & testament aforesaid  
 And I do also give & be unto my said daughter

Many Ann Lamar, without limitations or restrictions the following real estate, viz, All such lands lying & being in the County of Houston  
 Dooly, Brown & Early, not heretofore bequeathed or devised of which I  
 may be possessed at the time of my death except majority in the  
 fifth District of Houston County, Also lot number two hundred  
 forty one in the Second District of Monroe, Also number four  
 in the square number twenty three, on Jefferson Street, Also one quarter  
 acre lot number one, in square forty four on Franklin Street, Another  
 corner half acre lot number six two, square forty three, situate on the  
 corner of Franklin & Clay Street, and all the buildings  
 thereon, all lying and being in the town of Millidgeville.

In third, I will devise the sum of one thousand dollars to my son Andrew  
 Jackson Lamar, the following negro additional to his legacy in my  
 last Will & Testament aforesaid, viz, Sam child of old Jimmy, Illinois  
 son of old Wings, Arizah daughter of August, Sam daughter of Ellings,  
 Henry & Ghent children of Cyrus, Also ten additional sum of two  
 thousand dollars, Also fifteen hundred & fifty seven acres of land  
 lying east west of the Oconee River in Baldwin County State  
 aforesaid, being my old Cedar Shoals plantation, also lot number  
 forty in the fifth District of Houston County, containing two  
 hundred, two half acres of land And it is my will to desire  
 that my son Andrew Jackson Lamar's legacy in money to be raised  
 as provided in my last will & testament, by the sale of property  
 not bequeathed to debts that may be due to me shall be satisfied  
 by my executors, his Guardians, in good Bank Stock, or bound  
 out at legal interest and secured by bond & mortgage on  
 valuable landed property. In witness whereof I have  
 hereunto set my hand this twenty second day of  
 May in the year of our Lord Eighteen hundred Thirty two.
