

The Last Will of Elizabeth Dill

State of Georgia County of Clay

In the name of God amen I Elizabeth Dill of the State and County aforesaid knowing that I am but dust and unto dust must return being of sound and disposing mind & memory do ^{make} make and execute this and no other as my last will & testament in the words following

First I commend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the care of the ground to be buried in a decent and Christianlike manner
Second is my will and desire that all my just debts be faithfully and punctually paid

Third I give at my death my negro woman Jane to Mrs Sarah Wakefield the widow of W Wakefield dead.

Fourth I give my wardrobe to Mrs Sarah Towson

Fifth I give my watch to Miss Sarah Manable

Sixth I give all the balance of my effects ~~to~~ including notes accounts and money to Benjamin Manable

Seventh In order that this my last will and testament be carried into full effect I constitute and appoint my friend Ward H Wakefield my executor and it is my earnest desire & wish that he will qualify and settle the business of my estate as soon as possible

In witness whereof I the said Elizabeth Dill have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal to this my last will and testament written upon the foregoing page hereby revoking all former wills & testaments by me made this the twenty fifth day of February One thousand Eight hundred and Sixty four
