

## Record of the last Will and Testament of Erastus Davis

Georgia Know all men by these presents that I Erastus Davis  
 Clay County of said County being of sound mind and disposing memory  
 do here by declare the following to be my last Will & Testament to wit  
 Item 1<sup>st</sup> I will and bequeath to my son Erastus H. Davis One negro girl named  
 Betty & of which he is now in possession about twelve years old which I value  
 at two hundred and fifty dollars also the West half of the lot of land whereon  
 he now lives containing one hundred one and a fourth acres which I  
 value at One hundred & seventy five dollars

Item 2<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Elizabeth Steel  
 Horn One negro girl named Adeline about thirteen years of age  
 which she is now in the possession of under a deed of trust from me  
 and which I value at three hundred & fifty dollars also one hundred  
 one and a fourth acres of land it being the north half of  
 lot No (175) one hundred & seventy five which I value at three hundred  
 dollars

Item 3<sup>d</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved daughter Nancy Wood Davis  
 One negro girl named Eliza about sixteen years old and which she  
 is now in the possession of and is settled on her by Deed of trust  
 and which I value at four hundred & fifty dollars also the north  
 half of lot No (176) one hundred and seventy six which I value  
 at three hundred dollars

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son James L. Davis one negro girl  
 named Peggy about eight years old and which he is now in possession  
 of and which I value at one hundred & fifty dollars also one negro girl  
 named Jane about six years old which I value at three hundred dollars  
 also it is my will that out of the residue of my property my said (son)  
 James L. receive one hundred dollars for the purpose of purchasing  
 a horse also at my death a certain bed and furniture also when  
 he is twenty one a fifty dollar suit of clothes twenty five dollar  
 saddle & bridle

Item 5<sup>th</sup> It being my will that my wife Matilda Mann have to  
 live on until her death One hundred and twenty five acres (125)  
 acres of land it being the west half of lot No (210) two hundred &  
 ten in the fifth district of Originally Early now Clay County also  
 my household and kitchen furniture

Item 6<sup>th</sup> It being my design that my Children should at my death  
 be equal heirs to the residue of my estate I have made the above  
 distribution with the valuation attached that they might  
 thereby be the better able to carry out my wishes and it is  
 my will that after my decease after paying all my just  
 debts that the residue of my estate be equally divided among  
 them all so that after counting the amount given by their  
 presents to each that they receive severally the same amount

## Record of the last Will &amp; Testament of Esau Davis

Item 7<sup>th</sup> It is my will that after my decease I do hereby appoint Orran H Davis of Early County my true and lawful executor with full power in the best and most convenient way or manner to carry out this my last Will & Testament hereby revoking all former wills Given under my hand and seal this 21<sup>st</sup> day of October 1854 Signed sealed published and declared to be the last Will and Testament of Esau Davis the subscriber

In open Court came Parris M Burdson Daniel M Bruner and David Mashburn who being duly sworn depose and say that they saw Esau Davis sign seal publish and declare the writing here presented to contain his last will & testament that they signed the same as witnesses in the presence of each other that he was at the time of sound disposing mind & memory and that he executed the same freely without Compulsion so far as they know or believe this 6<sup>th</sup> day of August <sup>known to</sup> in open Court 6<sup>th</sup> day of August 1855
