 of Cotton to buy him a house, forty bushels Corn, a note of
 twenty dollars on William Shan, and a bed & bedstead
 during his life, and at his death to his daughter Mary
 Thompson, my buggy, a cart & one half of my bed clothes.
 - 3^d I give to my sister Ann Mercer three bays of Cotton, my
 large mirror, bed & a note on G. W. Thompson for seventy
 dollars, one half of my bed clothes.
 - 4th I give to my niece Margarett Ann Self wife of Larry
 Self my clock.
 - 5th I give to my sister Margarett Webster wife of Reuben Webster
 & Martha Childers five dollars each.
 - 6th I constitute & appoint my brother John Thompson executor
 to this my last will & testament.
