But remember that I, Barnett Northern of the state and county aforesaid being far advanced in age, and feeling that it might be my last will and testament in the following manner, to wit: that I, the said Barnett Northern do hereby give and bequeath to my wife Sophia the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid to her in about the same style as her first husband, to be laid in a plain, but decent Coffin, which shall not cost more than ten dollars and to be laid in my place that she may finish proper.

I give to my wife the free use of all of my household furniture during her natural life.

I leave of all of my effects in the hands of my executor whom I shall hereafter appoint, appointing him to manage the same as in his judgment may think most proper for the subsistence of the estate, and spend any balance of the same for the comfort and support of my beloved wife Sophia during her natural life.

After the death of my said wife, and as aforesaid, I direct that my daughter Julia A. Moor receive the entire furniture of my room excepting the rocking chair.

I give to my Grand daughter, Caroline Hendricks \$15.00 for her burial, and to her father in my presence when I wanted her the last time before her death.

I desire that the remainder of my estate be divided among my seven (7) grand daughters, to wit: namely, Georgia Ann Hendricks, Frances Famine Webb, Caroline Hendricks, Lebbie E. Matthews, Walter or Mary Northern, Julia Catherine Moor and her little sister Eva Colusa Moor.

I appoint J. H. Hanes my executor to carry out my will according to the tenor thereof. The testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal of my seal, this day & year above named.
