State of Georgia In the County of Clark I Daniel Jackson of the State and County
of said County being of advanced age but of sound
and disposing mind hereby testifying that I wish shortly after
this life it seems to right and proper both as regards my mind &
myself that I should make a disposition of the property which a
kind providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my
last will & testament hereby revoking all others heretofore by me made
First I desire direct that my body be buried in a decent & Christian
like manner suitable to my condition & circumstances in life
My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it
as I hope for salvation through the merits & atonement of his blessed
Son & Saviour Jesus Christ.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without
delay by my Executor hereinafter named & appointed.

Thirdly I give bequeath & devise to my beloved wife Sarah Taylor
a parcel of land more or less being one fourth of lot of land numbered
one hundred & thirty seven (137) being in the South east corner of
said lot situated in the Thirtieth district of Original Survey
now in Clayton County with all the rights & appurtenances
to said lot or parcel of land in any wise belonging to have &
to hold to her own proper use benefit & behoof for during her natural
life time or during her widowhood I also give & bequeath to my be-
loved wife in the same manner the sum of ten dollars worth of
and belonging to the farm on said lot and all my household
furniture furniture also my one horse wagon also my stock con-
sisting of one mare four head of Cattle & six head of Sheep
Fourthly If my wife should marry I direct that the property
real & personal given to her in the third article of this will be
equally divided between her and my son Joseph R
Jackson

Fifthly The residue of my property both real & personal
wherever it may be located to remain to my wife Sarah Taylor
to my wife Sarah in the third article of this will for and
during her natural life or during her widowhood (after her
death I give bequeath & devise to my son Joseph R
Jackson my free simple and several

Sixthly I hereby constitute and appoint my son Joseph R
Jackson who is of age Executor of this my last
my last will & testament This September 24th 1878
