make this my last will and Testament.

1st I have now direct that my body be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances
and condition in life My soul I trust shall return to rest
with God who gave it - as I hope for salvation through it
merits and atonement of the Prince of Peace and Savior
Jesus Christ.

2nd I direct that all of my just debts be paid
without delay by my executor hereafter appointed

3rd I give bequeath and devise to my beloved
wife Harriett H. Peacock the homestead where I
now live, containing nearly five acres more or less
being the West half of Lot No 141 C. One hundred and
forty in the 12th District of Originally Henry now
Clayton County - with the exception of twenty five
acres lying along the West line belonging to James
Peacock, with all the right members appertaining
to the said land in any manner belonging
free from all charges and limitation whatever
to her own proper use and benefit and
behold for and during her natural life. Also
hens and Hens and a cow and calf in the
same manner and also the barn hold and
kitchen furniture and provisions necessary
for a year's support. The remainder of my
lands consisting of parts of Lots No 141

Containing about two acres more or less and all
personal property not heretofore disposed of I
desire shall be sold and after all debts and
expenses paid the proceeds to be equally di-
vided between my children To wit: George H. Peacock

above.

4th All debts due me when collected to be
to go to my wife the said Harriett H. Peacock
