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I State of Georgia in the name of God Amen
County of Clayton I, Joshua Hall of said State
and Memory and advanced Age knowing that I must
shortly depart this life. know it right and proper both
as respects myself & family that I should make a
disposition of the Property with which a kind Providence
has blessed me I therefore make this my last will
and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all
others heretofore made by me

First I devise and direct that my body be buried
in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my
Circumstances in life & conditions My Soul I trust shall
return to rest with God who gave it As I hope for Salvation
through the merits and attonement of the shed blood
of Jesus Christ

Secondly I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid
without delay by my Executors hereinafter named and
appointed

Thirdly I give bequeath and devise to my beloved
Wife Pathera all my Personal Property to wit
One Cow and calf and three head of Hogs and all
of my House hold and kitchen furniture all and
every other thing that is due to us to the intent
of my Wife during her life time

Fourthly after the death of my Wife Pathera I
desire all the effects of my Estate be sold and
equally divided between my children Thomas
Hall David Hall and Elizabeth Crawford Martha
Norton Susan Guice and my two Grandchildren
of my Michel

Fifthly I hereby constitute my Son David Hall
Executor of this my last will & Testament
this June 16th 1877

this life to be its right end proper both in regards my mind &
body that I should make a disposition of the property which a
kind providence has blessed me. I do therefore make this my
last will & testament hereby revoking all others heretofore by me made
First I desire & direct that my body be buried in a decent & Christian
like manner suitable to my condition & circumstances in life
My soul I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it
as I hope for salvation through the merits & atonement of the blessed
Lord's precious Jesus Christ.

Secondly - I desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without
delay by my executor hereafter named & appointed.

Thirdly I give bequeath & devise to my beloved wife Sarah Tipton
widow of said man or less being one fourth of lot of land more
and divided & thirty seven (37) being in the South east corner of
said lot situated in the Thirtieth District of Original Survey
now Clayton County with all the rights & appurtenances
to said lot or parcel of land in any wise belonging to have &
to hold to her own proper use benefit & behoof for during her natural
life time or during her widowhood I also give & bequeath to my
beloved wife in the same manner the farming utensils used and
belonging to the farm on said lot and all my household
kitchen furniture also my one horse wagon also my stock con-
sisting of one mare four head of Cattle & six head of Sheep.
Fourthly If my wife should marry I direct that the property
real & personal given to her in the third article of this will be
equally divided between her and my dear son Josiah R
Jackson.

Fifthly The residue of my property both real & personal
when so ever & whosoever to my wife Sarah in the third article of this will for
during her natural life or during her widowhood (after her
natural life) I give bequeath & devise to my dear son Josiah R
Jackson in fee simple and forever.

Sixthly I hereby constitute and appoint my dear son Josiah R
Jackson who he be come of age Executor of this my last
my last will & testament This September 24th 1878
