the Eleventh part of all my estate that I shall die seized and possessed of
after all my just debts and expenses are paid.

Item 4th, I give and bequeath to the children of my son Henry Michel second,
the Eleventh part of all my estate that I shall die seized and possessed
of both real and personal after all my just debts & expenses are paid.

Item 5th, I give and bequeath to the children of my daughter Polly Campbell
the first wife of John Campbell the Eleventh part of all my estate
that I die seized and possessed of after all my just debts and expenses
are paid.

Item 6th, I give and bequeath to daughter Charlotte Huley the Eleventh part of all
my estate that I may die seized and possessed of after all my just debts
and expenses are paid.

Item 7th, I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Michel the Eleventh part of all my estate
that I may die seized and possessed of after all my debts and expenses are
paid.

Item 8th, I give and bequeath to five of the children of Elisabeth Jackson second
to wit, Emily Parish two dollars to Cissy Comp two dollars to James
Parish two dollars to Rose Ann Goldin two dollars to Martha G.
Wiggins two dollars. I give and bequeath to Wm G. Parrish son of
my daughter Elisabeth Jackson second, the Eleventh part of all my estate
after my debts and expenses are paid with the exception of the ten dollars
to the other five children a home named to be paid to him when he
shall arrive at the age of twenty-one years.

Item 9th, I give and bequeath to my son Ellen J. Michel the Eleventh part
of all my estate after all my debts and expenses are paid that I shall
die seized and possessed of.

Item 10th, I give and bequeath to my daughter Harriet J. Michel the Eleventh
part of all my estate after my debts and expenses are paid.

Item 11th, I give and bequeath to my son John W. Michel the Eleventh part
of all my estate that I may be seized and possessed of at my death after
all my just debts and expenses are paid.

Item 12th, Whereas I have been seized and paid of in full of my estate to my daughter
Ellen Thompson wife of Thomas Thompson I now give and bequeath to her
Eleven dollars to be paid out of the bequest of all my other children.

Item 13, I give and bequeath to children of my daughter Jane Cammel second second
wife of John Cammel the Eleventh part of all my estate after all my just
debts and expenses are paid.

Lastly I do ordain and appoint Jonathan Michel to be the executor of this my
last will and testament.
