my last will and Testament here by Revoking all others
here before made by me

First Thing I desire and direct that my body be Buried in a
secret and chaste like manner according to my Circumstances
and condition in life - my soul I will shall return to rest
with god who give it as I hope for Eternal Salvation
through the merits and Allowment of our blessed Lord
and savior Jesus Christ whose Religion I have Professed
and as it humbly has enjoyed for nearly ten years

Second Thing I desire and direct that all my Just debts
be Paid with out delay by my Executors here in after
Appointed as it may be necessary that my Just debts should be
delayed out of their rights especially in case of no necessity
for delay

Third Thing I give bequeath and devise my beloved wife Frances
the tract of land that I now live on - Part of Sec number 213
in the fifth district containing two hundred Acres more or
less and forty Acres in Lot number seveny nine in the north
East corner of said Lot during her natural life

Fourth Thing I give bequeath to my beloved wife Frances
during her natural life my negro woman Harriet a bout fifty five
years of age and my negro man Charles a bout twenty five
years old and my negro woman Susan a bout twenty four
years old

Fifth Thing I give bequeath and devise a bond wife during her
natural life all of my Stock of Every kind and household
and kitchen furniture and all of my Revolution tools of Every
kind

Sixth Thing - I give by direct at the death of my wife that my
Property shall be sold or divided Equal among all my children
and direct that James S. K. Miller shall have his mothers Part
with the rest of my children

Seventh Thing I here by constitute and appoint my beloved wife
Frances Executor and my son James S. Chambers Executor
and to be trustee for my son Joseph a minor and they may
give my son Joseph his Property when he reaches it they shall do
as the my Just will and Testament
