of lawful age but of sound mind disposing
mind, knowing that I must shortly depart this life,
deem it right and proper, both as respect my
family and myself, that I should make and sta-
ble of the property which I hold Providence
has blessed me. I do therefore make this my last
will and testament.

First I do give and direct that my body be buried
in or decent and Christian life, and as to
my condition and circumstances in life, my soul
I commit to God who gave it and I hope for salvation
through Jesus Christ.

Second I do bequeath and devise to my beloved
wife Margaret A. Tanner one hundred and fifty
acres of land being the West half of Lot number (104)
our hundred and eight, and one fourth of Lot
number (104) one hundred and nine extending
the whole way across said Lot on the East side
divided by a creek and being in the Township of
West of Clayton County near Clayton County
with all the rights thereunto in law and equity
belonging thereto belonging for and during
her natural life - After which the said

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I want to be well and the said my wife Mary Jane Barton and I desire that our house and lot situate in the City of Atlanta Number 80 + 29, of the German town survey and situated in German town and West Street and of Lane Lot No 80, shall be at the time of my death equally of J. F. Farmer either public or private sale as he may deem best and the proceeds of the same to be devoted to the payment of my just debts and the remainder to be equally divided between my wife and children.

Fourthly, I desire that said J. F. Farmer shall after my death sell all the personal effects of which I am now the possessor of, in such manner he may think best and after giving my daughter Margaret T. Smith and my son and fifty dollars and Susan A. Spear thirty dollars. I desire the remainder after all debts and necessary expenses are paid to be equally divided between my wife Mary and J. F. Farmer, J. F. Farmer, Mary Jane Barton Susan A. Spear C. P. Farmer and Margaret T. Farmer. Further, their heirs and assigns.

Fifthly, I hereby consent and appoint my beloved son J. F. Farmer executor of this my last will and testament.
