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10 I leave and bequeath unto the wife of my loved and last fore disposed
of in this my will known as my home place and homestead as follows: the
East by E. Mountree, on the West by lands owned in town 2nd of this
west West by E. Mountree and the Lake Stationer and South by J. H.
Gay and J. H. Hamilton supposed to be about one hundred and
thirteen acres more or less the same being all the land I now own
to my two old maid sisters namely Martha and Winifred & this
to have the use of said land during their natural life and if one
of them should die leaving the other as survivor the survivor to have
the use and rent of said land as long as she should live and at the
death of both of them then I desire and so direct said land to be sold
and occupied by J. H. Hamilton he said J. H. Hamilton to have the use
and proceeds of said land as long as he should live, not subject to any contract
or debt that he may contract or make and at his the said J. H. Hamilton's
death I desire and give said land to the body heirs of said Hamilton to
be their property forever in fee simple, and I mean by body heirs his
children who may survive said Martha & Winifred & this will the
said J. H. Hamilton or if any of said J. H. Hamilton's children should
not survive then but leave children then said children should
take under them will the same as their parents if they were
living
