I therefore make this my last will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all others heretofore made by me Item first I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances and conditions in life My soul I trust shall return to God who gave it, as I hope for eternal salvation through the blessed Lord and savior Jesus Christ whose Religion I profess and humbly hope I enjoy I now desire and direct that all my just debts be paid without delay and unnecessary delay by my Executors hereinafter named

Item third I give and devise to my beloved wife Susan all my land consisting of fifty acres of lot one hundred and seventy four (174) and fifteen acres of lot one hundred and forty eight (148) and forty four acres on the west side of lot one hundred and seven (147) to have and to hold, together with proper use and benefit during her natural life, and thereafter with the exception of a lease given to my son W. F. Bennett, on the whole for my support Old Lease to Expire December fifteen hundred and eighty three my wife Susan to take Control to have and to hold as above stated -

Item fourth I give and devise to my daughter Adeline one hundred dollars out of the value of my property at her mother's decease and then the Balance to be equally divided among my heirs the Adeline coming in for an equal share with the rest after having received two hundred dollars extra above the rest

Item the fifth I constitute my beloved sons N. B. Wallis and W. H. Wallis Executors of this my last will and Testament this March 19th 1877

Adams sons or issue or left of land lying in the South East corner of Lot No 141 in the Twelfth District of Originality being now Clayton County with all the rights members and appurtenances belonging thereto to their own proper use benefit and behoof with power to dispose of the same as they may deem proper Such land to be equally divided between said Harriett A. S. Peacock Henry C. Adams and said children of W. J. Adams deceased I give and bequeath to my son A. M. Adams note amounting to \$150.00 which he is indebted to me I give and bequeath to my son Oliver W. Adams five acres more or less of land in the South East corner of Lot number (141) lying West of the Public Road with all the rights members and appurtenances belonging thereto to their own proper use benefit and behoof with power to dispose of as they may deem best I give to my daughter Mary M. A. Adams and my daughter Sarah M. C. Adams

and my daughter Harriett Adams three acres of land lying in the North East corner of Lot of Land number (141) in the 12th District of Originality being now Clayton County together with all the rights members and appurtenances belonging thereto with power to dispose of as they may think best Such land to be equally divided between them I give to Thomas B. W. Adams my year Rents and profits of three acres of land Corn for the year 1872 I give to my daughter

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
