

I, Jonathan Phillips of said state and county being of advanced age and being of sound mind, knowing that I must shortly depart this life do hereby make and publish my last will and testament in the presence of the persons with which a friend has been consulted and I do therefore make this my last will and testament, hereby revoking all others made by me.

1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances in life, may God I trust shall return to rest with God who gave it, as I hope for salvation through the merits of our atonement of "our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ" also that my executor here after named have good and substantial burial place placed over my grave and also over the grave of my beloved wife Pety Phillips and my little grand son Jefferson Davis that burial be the last of my estate by my executor.

2nd I desire and direct that all of my just debts be paid by my executor without delay.

3rd I give and devise to my beloved wife for life Pety Phillips all of my estate including every thing both lands and personalty the lands in which I now reside. Containing one hundred and thirty four acres of land lot No. also all of my stock and all other effects owned by me at my death, with the right to use as she desires and if necessary for her comfort and maintenance to dispose of so much of the personalty as she may think necessary by the request and direction of my Executor with the right and to draw and receive the same as she desires, also she is to have all of the rents and profits including such stock as hogs and cows and horses arising or realized from my estate, it being my object and desire that my beloved wife shall have a sufficiency for life to make her comfortable and happy that all except the land is to belong absolutely to her during her life.

4th I desire and direct that after the death of my beloved wife Pety Phillips that my executor herein after named proceed to take charge of and after giving notice by advertisement in the papers in which the Sheriff ad vertisements are published for Clayton County for four weeks that he shall sell all of my effects that all of my estate may be converted into money when otherwise agreed upon by all the heirs and divided as herein after directed.

5th I give and devise to my grandson Jonathan Phillips Williams one hundred dollars and to my grandson Judge Jonathan Kirkland fifty (50) dollars to be paid by my executor of my estate.

6th I give and devise and direct that after paying all expenses and the amounts herefor mentioned that my estate or the remainder thereof be divided as follows: I will and bequeath to my daughter Martha Jane Kirkland the hundred dollars (100) and to my daughter Pety Abigail Williams four hundred dollars (400) and to the heirs of my daughter Miriam Henderson three hundred (300) dollars if there is enough to make these said sums. If not to be divided in the same proportion and should there be over fifteen hundred dollars, the remainder over and above that amount to be divided in the same proportion, it being my intention and desire that these three my daughter Jane Kirkland should have 1/3 and Pety Abigail Williams 1/3 and the heirs of my daughter Miriam Henderson 1/3 of my estate.

7th I give and bequeath to the heirs of my son Lewis Macky Phillips the five hundred dollars he having already received that amount as advanced to him and his said heirs by me, I therefore will and direct that his heirs having received their prower there are not to receive or share any thing more of my estate he having already received that amount.

8th I hereby make and constitute W. M. Wright my executor of this my last will and testament this the 15th day of 1882
