 Clayton County } In the name of God. I, Susan P. William Esq
 of sound mind and memory and knowing the uncertainty of
 life, and wishing to give direction as to the disposition of
 my property, I hereby declare that I have made after
 my death, as I wish and constitute this my last
 Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling
 all others heretofore made by me.

Art 1st - I give and bequeath to my beloved wife for and
 during her natural life all of my estate both real
 and personal consisting of the whole of one and
 a half portion of Lot No 35 & 36 of my tract of all
 kinds growing crop household and kitchen fur-
 niture and any other item of property I may
 have.

Art 2nd - I hereby authorize and direct my executor
 and Creditors here in after named if it should
 become necessary after my death to pay my debts or
 if at any time it should become necessary to support
 my wife to sell of twenty five acres out of the fourth por-
 tion of the seventh line acres of Lot No 35, this
 is only to be done when my executor and Creditors in
 their sound discretion find that it is necessary for the
 purposes above mentioned. I also give entire power
 to sell said land if it become necessary to do so either
 at public or private sale in such a manner as they
 think will be to the best advantage.

Art 3rd - I direct that after the death of my wife that all
 of my land left at her death go to my three sons
 James E. Campbell, John Will Campbell, John
 H. Campbell. to be divided and shared off as they
 may see proper. The reason for giving it to my
 three sons exclusive of my other children is that
 have had what I consider a fair portion of my estate
 already.

Art 4th - I direct that my wife Martha P. Campbell shall have
 full power to take charge of all my personal property
 and to dispose of the same as she shall see proper,
 hereby giving her the sole and full title to the same so that
 she may in whatever manner it is suit to her.

Art 5th - I hereby constitute my beloved wife Martha P. Campbell
 and my son James E. Campbell my executors
 + Creditors to carry out this my last Will & Testament
 In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 this 25th day of July 1879. W. P. Campbell

Peacock of said state and county being of sound
age but of sound disposing mind and memory recognizing the
certainty of death due it right and property last as usual, my
my family and myself that I should make a disposition of
the property with which a kind Providence has blessed me, I do
make this my last will and Testament.

1st I desire and direct that my body be buried in a decent
and Christian like manner suitable to my circumstances
and condition in life My soul I trust shall return to rest
with God who gave it - as I hope for salvation through it
merits and atonement of the blood of our Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ -

2nd I direct that all of my just debts be paid
without delay by my executor hereafter appointed
3rd I give bequeath and devise to my beloved
wife Hannett H. Peacock the homestead where I
now live, containing nearly five acres more or less
being the West half of Lot No 141C One hundred and
fifty in the 12th District of Equally Henry ward
Clayton County - with the exception of twenty five
acres lying along the West line belonging to Fannie
Peacock, with all the right member appurtenances
to the said land in any manner belonging
free from all charges and limitation whatever
to her own proper use and benefit and
support for and during her natural life. Her
horns and Buggy and a cow and calf in the
same manner and also the household and
kitchen furniture and provision necessary
for a year support. The remainder of my
lands consisting of part of Lots No 141
Containing twenty two acres more or less and all
personal property not heretofore disposed of I
desire shall be sold and after all debts and
expenses paid the proceeds to be equally di-
vided between my children, To wit, George H. Peacock
Emma H. Peacock and John H. Peacock and after the death
of my wife the property hereunto to her be sold and
the proceeds equally divided between my children named
above.

4th All debts due me when collected to owing
to go to my wife the said Hannett H. Peacock
for her use. I hereby constitute and ap-
point my wife Hannett H. Peacock as
