make a will disposition of the property

last will and testament hereby revoking
and annulling all others by me heretofore
made.

First, I desire and direct that my body be bur-
ied in a decent and Christianlike man-
ner suitable to my circumstances and con-
dition in life my Soul I trust shall
return to God who gave it as hope for
Salvation through the merits and atone-
ments of the Blessed Lord and Saviour
Jesus Christ.

Second, I desire all of my just debts be paid
as soon as possible by my Executors
herein appointed and named.

Third, as I have already given Month
Comer in a will I desire that each
of the other Children be given a Cow
each to wit Angelina, Fidelity, Galen,
Elsie, Adalace, and Margaret all
heirs of my body each one to have the
inches of these several Cows, providing
that untill marriage of any of - or
each of the children above named the cat-
tles so distributed shall remain on the
farm and be subject to the control of
my Executors.

Fourth, I desire that the slaves and

Fifth I desire that the debts that I owe
be paid from the proceeds of sale of
present crop after a good harvest
for the family has been set apart.
also two bullocks Sea Island Cotton now
on hand shall be sold for the same
purpose.

Sixth I wish all my property of
Every description including Mules
Cattle, Hogs, Sheep, Goat, Wagon
with harness, buggy, and harness,
household and kitchen furniture,
form and Mechanical tools together with
with all other effects to remain as it
now is for the use and benefit of my
family until the death of my Executrix
then I wish an Equal distribution
made of what is remaining, among
the children to wit: Martha, Angeline,
John, Julius, Eliza, Adeline,
and Margaret. Provided that, if
at any time my Executrix may see
proper she may at any time sell
part or all of the Estate for the
benefit of her self heirs here
mentioned but at no time shall
any fractional part of the Lands
be sold.

Eighth I do hereby appoint my wife
Eliza Moore Executrix of this my
last will and Testament this August
23rd 1890 William M. Moore
